

## 4-H is Department 18 and FFA is Department 28 4-H AND FFA SHEEP REGULATIONS

### DNA HAIR SAMPLES REQUIRED FOR MARKET LAMB CLASSES.

The exhibitor is responsible for providing a DNA hair sample and their Agriculture Teacher or Extension Agent witnessing, to be mailed to the Missouri State Fair office on or before postmark date of June 15. The DNA envelopes must have the correct postmark date on them, and also be received within 10 days following. (Faxes are not permitted. Metered mail is not preferred, but if used, please allow sufficient time for delivery.) An exhibitor may nominate a total of 10 market lambs. See complete DNA hair sample rules outlined in number 16 of the 4-H and FFA general rules and regulations in this premium guide.

1. All breeding animals must have been owned by the exhibitor prior to July 3 of the year shown, and all breeding animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name. Breeding animal must wear the association or flock ear tag at the time of showing. Market lambs must have been owned by the exhibitor prior to June 1 of current year. Entries must be complete for both breeding classes and market lamb show.
2. Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter 4 ram lambs and 4 ewe lambs in the lamb classes. (Exhibitors will be allowed to show from one to four animals in any one class, but not more than 4 lambs total.) Yearling classes are limited to two entries per class. No limit is placed on the number of market lamb entries within a class.
3. The base date for computing the ages of sheep in all classes will be September 1, but only those animals that have lamb teeth will be eligible to show in the lamb classes.
4. Market lambs will show by breeds. Classes will be divided into groups by weight. Market lambs will be weighed only one time. 4-H will show first.
5. Ewe lambs shown in the market lamb show will not be eligible for the wether dam or breed shows. Exhibitors can substitute a ewe lamb for a wether dam or a wether dam for a ewe lamb; this can be done at the scales, at weigh-in.
6. Market Lambs show order: Crossbred, Speckled Face, Natural Colored, (blue fibered) Suffolk, Hampshire, (no blue fibered) Shropshire, Oxford, Southdown, Dorset, Montadale, Dorper and "AOB (classifier to determine).
7. Muzzles will not be allowed on market lambs or breeding animals.
8. **All market lambs** must be slick-sheared at the time of arrival at the Fairgrounds, including all areas above hock-knee and from the ears back and report to the Race Horse Barns on the east side of the Fairgrounds for animal inspection and weigh in. No additional shearing in the Sheep Barn after weigh-in.
9. Abuse of animals: Should any physical abuse be observed toward an animal, either in the barn or in the show ring, Superintendent has the authority to eliminate show animal and exhibitor from the show.
10. When a judge is handling lambs or when you are waiting to be judged, all four (4) feet must be on the ground. It is acceptable to briefly lift the front end of a lamb off the ground to set the front feet.
11. Market lambs may not leave the sheep barn or wash rack area once they have been penned until the conclusion of the show. Walking/leading sheep for exercise must be within the confines of the sheep barns. The Sheep Superintendent must authorize any lambs needing to leave the sheep barn or wash rack. **Lambs found in unauthorized areas will be dismissed from the show.**
12. Breeding sheep showmanship winners will be selected during the 4-H and FFA breeding sheep shows. Breeding sheep showmanship winners must skip a year and are then eligible to compete again. There will be a separate showmanship contest for market lamb exhibitors.
13. No assistance in showing animals will be allowed in the market lamb classes.
14. Minimal assistance is allowed in the breeding classes. The owner must exhibit the animal with assistance in placing feet and control of the animal in emergency situations. Assistance must be another Missouri junior exhibitor.
15. Pumping of any species, unless under the State Veterinarian's supervision, will not be allowed.
16. 4-H Food Quality Assurance Policy for 2024  
By June 1, 2024, all 4-H members enrolled in food animal projects including beef, sheep, swine, dairy cattle, meat and dairy goats, rabbits and poultry must complete the appropriate level of Missouri Show Me Quality Assurance certification to be considered a 4-H member in good standing in that project. No further quality assurance documentation is needed with the State Fair entry.  
**NOTE:** 4-H members must be in good standing in their county to enter the State Fair food animal related competitions.

## 4-H is Department 18 and FFA is Department 28 4-H & FFA SHEEP FITTING COMPETITION August 10, 2024, 6:30 p.m. - Sheep Pavilion

Set-up time for youth: 1 hour following the last junior show of the day.

**OBJECTIVE:** To provide youth with the opportunity to compete in sheep fitting at the state level as an art form to enhance and improve the standard and image of the sheep industry to the public and sheep producers.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Pasture lamb unwashed will be provided for contestants.
2. The sheep will be assigned numbers, and contestants will pick numbers at random.
3. Team will consist of 2 team members.
4. 2 fitters on the team; both can be junior's age (12 & UNDER), 1 must have shown in either the Wether dam show or the junior breeding show. Both fitters should have been age eligible to show in the Breeding show.
5. Total time includes washing, drying, shearing-fitting. no limit on washing.
6. Participant will provide a trimming stand and traditional fitting equipment to fit the sheep provided for competition.
7. May use as many clippers as needed, but all must have at least a 20-tooth comb or finer.
8. Must create a ring ready animal - may be; fitted, slicked, wool style. Team choice.
9. Final score and placing will be based on the wash job, cleanliness, smoothness of trimming job, hoof trimming, overall presentation and process used to attain the goal.
10. One member of team is to pre-enter – (pre-entry required). Entry should be made when entering other sheep.
11. Entries will be made through the Missouri State Fair on-line entry system or on entry forms provided in this premium guide and be returned to the Missouri State Fair along with your sheep entries. An entry form will need to be submitted in order to participate.
14. A \$5.00 entry fee is required. (Individual or Team)
15. First Place individual or team winners are not eligible to participate in same age division in future years.

- 512 Team Fitting Competition - 2 hours time limit
- 513 Junior Age (8-12 years of age) - Individual - 1 1/2 hours time limit
- 514 Intermediate Age (13-16 years of age) - Individual - 1 3/4 hours time limit

### YOUTH SHEEP SKILLATHON

**August 11, 3:00 p.m. - Sheep Pavilion Arena  
Hosted by Lincoln University Extension and  
University of Missouri Extension**

1. The Sheep Skillathon is an opportunity for youth (4-H and FFA) with an interest in livestock to test their knowledge and abilities of sheep production.
2. Youth will participate in one of three age divisions: Junior (8 – 10); Intermediate (11 – 13); Senior (14 and over). Division winners will progress to the next division.
3. Participants will participate in three areas:
  - a) Identification – Breeds, Feed ingredients, Parts, Equipment, Retail Cuts
  - b) Multiple Choice Exam – Sheep management/production, Current industry topics, Medication protocols
  - c) Verbal Communications - 5 to 10 minutes interview regarding sheep industry and/or involvement in sheep project. Participants will be evaluated on their understanding of concepts of sheep production, knowledge of personal sheep project and/or importance of issues facing sheep industry, and ability to communicate thoughts in a clear and organized manner. Depth of evaluation will vary based on participant age category.
4. Results and awards will be presented in the show arena of the Sheep Pavilion following the conclusion of the competition at 5:00 pm.

WETHER DAM CLASSES

All 4-H and FFA market wether and wether dam sheep exhibitors (sheep showing on Thursday or Friday) must report to the Race Horse Barns on the east side of the Fairgrounds for animal inspection and Sheep Pavilion for weigh in.

See the Sheep Schedule, under Open Sheep for arrival times. ALL WETHER DAMS MUST BE SLICK-SHORN BEFORE ARRIVING AT THE MISSOURI STATE FAIRGROUNDS! Note

1. These classes have been set up to allow new junior breeding sheep to be shown at the Missouri State Fair. They are not designed to provide additional classes for same sheep already shown in other classes.
2. These classes are set up for breeding animals that are not able to show in the breeding classes of the junior show (because they do not have papers).
3. No animal that is shown in the regular market classes will be eligible to show in the wether dam classes.
4. No breed is to be specified on the entry form before the Fair. (Just class number - such as 61).
5. Any wether dams entering the Fairgrounds with market lambs on August 10, 2023, must be inspected by veterinarians, but should not be weighed with other market lambs.

SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST FOR YOUTH EXHIBITORS

First place winners in each category are not eligible to participate in the same age division the next year. While this activity is offered in an age bracket contest format, the committee desires that members enhance and improve their skills and performance for the long term benefit of the entire sheep industry.

The contest will be open for anyone exhibiting a market lamb or wether dam at the 2024 Missouri State Fair within their age bracket. Exhibitors must provide and use their own animal. The age brackets will be as follows: 8-10 Junior; 11-13 Intermediate; 14-16 Senior; and 17-21 Senior Pro.

First place in each showmanship class will receive a plaque. The contest will start at 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 7 at the Sheep Pavilion. Age bracket sign up registration sheets will be available Wednesday afternoon at the Sheep Pavilion announcers' stand.
