### BEEF CATTLE HERDSMAN AWARD

The Missouri State Fair will award two \$80 awards, plus attractive plaques, to the herdsman in charge of the two most outstanding beef cattle exhibits. A committee will make inspections to determine the winners. The following points will be considered: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits; 2) handling of feed, equipment, etc. and keeping same out of the alleys; and 3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and show ring.

The 2023 Beef Cattle Herdsman award was presented to Gregory Polled Herefords and Whiskey River Livestock.

### Best-Kept Beef Cattle Exhibit Barn

The Missouri State Fair will award a plaque, to be hung in the Beef Cattle Office, to the breed that has demonstrated and presented its entire exhibit barn and is considered by the committee to be the best-kept barn during the course of the Fair. The following points will be considered: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits; 2) handling of feed, equipment, etc. and keeping same out of the alleys; and 3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and show ring.

The Best-Kept Beef Cattle Exhibit Barn in 2023 was Hereford and Limousin.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

**Note** All exhibitors, except beef cattle, must bring their own bedding during the 2024 Fair. Livestock exhibitors are also expected to bring their own feed – additional feed and bedding will not be available for purchase during the Fair.

Beef cattle exhibitors will be provided Premium Missouri Mulch bedding for \$10 per head which will be included in the price of entries. No other bedding will be allowed for beef cattle including sawdust, pellets, etc. Dairy cattle exhibitors may continue adding straw to the bedding. All exhibitors should practice good environmental stewardship, keeping the bedding clean and free of glass, plastics, cans and other trash for the purposes of the Fair's recycling agreement.

- Exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations and animal health requirements for exhibitors in this premium book.  
**Violation of these rules may result in any or all of the following:**
  - Withholding or return of payment for the animal or exhibit, premiums and awards.
  - Suspension from future exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission. Suspensions can be for any length of time and may be permanent.
  - Probationary exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time and under such terms and conditions to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
  - Assessment of any other penalty determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
- All entries must be received by July 8.
- When there is only one (1) exhibit in a class, the exhibitor will receive half of the premium money for the placing awarded by the judge.
- The Missouri State Fair does not guarantee premium money, merchandise, prizes or special awards. Because the State Fair Commission is without constitutional or statutory authority to borrow money for its operation, it reserves the right to prorate premium money because of state budget restraints.
- All group classes** must be pre-entered by July 8 in order to show. Individual animals shown in all of the group and herd classes listed must have been entered and shown in one of the classes for single animals. This includes Junior breeding cattle. **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.**

- Entry fee for **4-H/FFA Breeding Beef Cattle** will be \$21.00 per head, DOES NOT enter the juniors into the Open show; **OPEN Breeding Beef Cattle** will be \$30.00 per head. Entry fee for **4-H/FFA Steers, 4-H/FFA Market Heifers and Crossbred Heifers** will be \$20.00 per head. The Missouri State Fair will provide bedding in the barn for all beef cattle exhibits. Bedding will not be furnished for the tie-out area.
- New for 2024- No late entries will be accepted. All entries are due by July 8, 2024 at 5:00 p.m. New**
- Any herd owners desiring to come on grounds or set up their stalls before the arrival date, as stated in the catalog, must check with the Beef Cattle Superintendent. If an exhibitor plans to request an "early release" in order to show at another fair, it will be necessary to have a copy of the entry in that fair, or a letter from the fair stating that the exhibitor has made an entry with them.
- Application for entry in purebred classes must show registry numbers of each animal entered. No application will be accepted until this information is received.
- Substitutions will be allowed on the basis of a heifer for a heifer and a bull for a bull, regardless of age within a breed, per exhibitor.
- Display herds shall be allowed under the following guidelines: The new breed/show shall make a written request to the Director of the Missouri State Fair by November 1 of the year prior to the show in which they wish to participate. After approval from the Missouri State Fair Commission, the breed/show will be allowed to be displayed at the Fairgrounds. The breed/show shall abide by all rules of the department for which the display is granted. The superintendent shall oversee all aspects of the display herd. The display herd shall not be allowed to show before a judge provided by the Missouri State Fair. The Fair shall not supply any ribbons, plaques, or premiums to the display herd. The display herd shall make a written request each year. The same entry fees shall be paid by all exhibitors regardless of show status.
- All money is offered only in open competition. No exhibitor will be permitted to make more than two entries in any one class.
- All livestock exhibitors may purchase exhibitor passes according to the fee schedule in the front of this book. Remittance for passes must be sent with entry.
- Stalls, feed and bedding information may be found in the general rules of this catalog. Superintendents will not require feed releases.
- Any stalls not used by exhibitor but paid for by the exhibitor will be forfeited to be used at the discretion of the Beef Cattle Superintendent for stalling of other cattle. Any refund requests must be received prior to July 8.
- All beef cattle exhibitors should enter GATE 4.
- No trucks or trailers will be permitted to park behind the beef barns except while loading and unloading. After unloading, livestock trailers may park in Restricted Lot A, west of Gate 4. Vehicles found in restricted areas without the proper hang tags are subject to towing at owner's expense.
- Beef tie-out gates will be closed daily at 8 a.m. and opened at 7 p.m. Cattle may be led to tie-out areas after 7:00 p.m. and must be returned to stalls by 8:00 a.m. Any cattle remaining in the tie-out area after 8 a.m. will not be allowed to enter the grounds.
- The tie-out area will open August 4 at noon for Angus, Charolais, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Simmental and exhibition cattle. No space may be reserved for any other breed, steers, market heifers or crossbred heifers, prior to August 10. Any exhibitor doing so will be disqualified from exhibiting with no refund and will be ineligible to exhibit at the 2024 Missouri State Fair.
- Limited exhibitor camping is available by reservation. The tie-out area will open August 4 at noon.
- All cattle must be in their respective places on the arrival date as stated in catalog.
- All health papers are to be delivered to the Beef Cattle Superintendent at times designated.
- No grooming chutes will be allowed in the show barns except on show day.
- No power washers will be allowed on wash rack.
- Fans:** All fans will be pointed in the direction indicated by arrows on the wall or stall.
- No Port-a-cool units allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. Only self-contained misters will be permitted on the fairgrounds.
- No artificial filling of any cattle will be allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. No pumps will be allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.**
- There are to be no nurse cows on the fairgrounds.
- ALL BULLS 1 YEAR OF AGE AND OLDER MUST SHOW WITH A NOSE LEAD.** Entry into the show ring without one will be an automatic disqualification. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Beef Cattle Superintendent and Staff.
- There will be no dogs allowed in the exhibit barns except those entered in a show, police dogs on duty, or those trained to aid a person with disabilities.
- Failure to comply with the above regulations will result in the forfeiture of any or all premiums won.
- When 9 or more head entered and checked into any single class, the class shall be split, as determined, by age, by the Beef Cattle Superintendent and staff.

**Exhibition requirements for cattle, bison, and exotic bovids**

1. Intrastate (cattle in Missouri moving within Missouri for exhibition only).
  - a. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
  - b. All cattle must be individually identified by an official ear tag as defined by official identification, or registration tattoo, or any other means approved by the state veterinarian, be individually listed on a CVI, and be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
  - c. Brucellosis – no test is required.
  - d. Tuberculosis – no test is required.
2. Interstate (cattle from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
  - a. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
  - b. All cattle must be individually identified by an official ear tag as defined by official identification, or registration tattoo, or any other means approved by the state veterinarian, be individually listed on a CVI, and be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
  - c. Brucellosis
    - i. Cattle from Brucellosis-Free States. No brucellosis test or entry permit is required.
    - ii. Cattle from brucellosis Class A states
      1. Test-eligible animals include all sexually intact animals eighteen (18) months for age and over.
      2. All test-eligible cattle must be tested and negative within thirty (30) days prior to entry except-
      3. Cattle from a certified brucellosis-free herd. The certified herd number and the date of the last test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection;
      3. Steers. No brucellosis test required but must be individually identified and listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; and
      4. Rodeo bulls from a Class A state than must have a negative brucellosis test within twelve (12) months prior to exhibition.
  - d. Tuberculosis
    - i. Beef cattle- all classes of beef cattle (including exotic bovids and bison), two (2) months of age and over entering Missouri for exhibition must meet the following requirements:
    - ii. All classes of beef cattle entering Missouri for exhibition for a state having a Tuberculosis free status may enter without additional testing requirements or entry permit;
    - iii. All classes of beef cattle six (6) months of age and older, entering Missouri for exhibition for a state having a Tuberculosis status less than free must meet the following requirements;
      1. Must obtain an entry permit.
      2. Must have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days of shipment, test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
      3. Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd (herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection); or
      4. Move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year (date of herd test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection)

The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head).

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at [www.angus.org](http://www.angus.org).

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

There can be no substitutions such as a bull for a heifer or heifer for a bull. However, a bull can be substituted for a bull or heifer for a heifer.

There can be no added entries after entry deadline. This includes group classes. **Be sure to enter group classes.**

Premiums will be awarded on a graduated basis in each class. Group classes subject to change in premium amounts.

#### American Angus Association Participation Statement

The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums.

#### OPEN SHOW AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION® SHOW CLASSIFICATION FOR ANGUS

Any classes listed in this classification, which exceeds 15 head per class, should be broken into smaller classes. This should be accomplished by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date.

Furthermore, the recommended number of head per class varies per show based on number of head checked in. See recommendations below:

-Shows with less than 100 head: 8 head or less per class

-Shows with 100 – 200 head: 12 head or less per class

-Shows with more than 200 head: 15 head or less per class.

Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance.

**If there are more than 30 head in a division, the division should be split into Division 1, 2, etc.**

**Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.**

- 1 Cow/Calf Class – cows three (3) years of age and younger, cows must be born 1/1/2021 through 8/31/2022. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

**RULES**

1. The Beefalo Show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations of the Missouri State Fair.
2. All animals' tattoos will be checked for legibility and must match the registration papers for that animal. Animals with illegible tattoos or incorrect papers will not be allowed to show.
3. Any animal upon check-in which does not have legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
5. All Bull entries must be registered in the exhibitor's or farm name as either Purebred or Full-blood Beefalo.
6. All Female entries must be registered in the exhibitor's or farm name with any Beefalo registry.
7. Exhibitors do not have to be ABA members.
8. All animals must be registered with a Beefalo registry.
9. The age grouping of any or all classes may be altered to equalize the numbers of animals exhibited in each class.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. The Brahmousin Show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations of the Missouri State Fair.
2. All entries must be at least 3/8 Brahman or more.
3. All entries must be recorded with their own breed association and exhibitors must be in good standing with that association.
4. All animals' tattoos will be checked for legibility and must match the registration papers for that animal. Animals with illegible tattoos or incorrect papers will not be allowed to show.
5. Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
6. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
7. Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. Calves over 60 days MUST have registration papers.
8. Calves under 60 days of age that are being shown in an individual class, besides the cow/calf class, must have registration and tattoos.
9. Animals are eligible for entry in only one individual class with the exception of a calf at the side of a cow. That calf may be entered in an individual class if the appropriate fees are paid and calf follows the above guidelines.
10. Heifers exhibited at 24 months of age or older must be accompanied by a veterinary attested certificate of pregnancy.
11. All prize monies will be awarded in individual classes.
12. All animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward in a natural state that is flat to the entire body, which includes the legs and tail head.

The American-International Charolais Association will provide 25% of the open Charolais show premiums not to exceed \$2,000. AICA percentage of premium money is paid directly to the show to be included in the exhibitors' premium money check.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; NO PHOTOCOPIES.
2. An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.
3. Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.
4. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
5. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.
6. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
7. Bulls from classes 32, 33, 34, 35, and 36 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
8. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2021. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2020, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
9. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
10. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and that all bulls 1 year or age or older must show with a nose lead.
11. All exhibits of Charolais Breeding Cattle shall be governed by the AICA rules and regulation, Article XV, titled exhibition of animals, the inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in article XV, paragraph C, of the association rules and regulations and non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in paragraph D of the same article XV.
12. ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."
13. Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.
14. Where circumstances exist and / or allow, AICA reserves the right to split large individual classes after the check-in procedure is complete.

Determination of classes will be made at the show after all animals are checked in. Individual classes will be divided into as nearly equal numbers as possible, depending on natural age breaks of entries and the final number of animals to be exhibited. The classes will be determined by the Beef Cattle Superintendent and staff.

The Minor, Major or Super Show status has been eliminated and replaced with a five-tier point system based solely on the number of head exhibited. Points will be based on number of head shown within the Gelbvieh division and Balancer division separately, not on number entered and not on a total of Gelbvieh and Balancers shown.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors of Gelbvieh cattle will be required to pay a \$15.00 per head processing fee to the Heart of America Gelbvieh Association, to be paid at check-in of entries.
- All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor. A copy of the registration paper or an affidavit of registration must accompany each animal to the show. Percentage and purebred Gelbvieh females (75% to 100%) will show together. Gelbvieh bulls (75% to 100%) will show together.
- A 75% female or bull that qualifies to show either as a Gelbvieh or Balancer, can only be entered and exhibited in one division at a show. Exhibitors must designate Gelbvieh or Balancer as "breed" at the time of entry - NO changes will be allowed after entries are received.
- A 75% female, eligible to show either as a Gelbvieh or Balancer could earn points throughout the year in both the Gelbvieh and Balancer divisions, depending on how it was entered and exhibited. These points will NOT be combined. The AGA allows 25%-75% Gelbvieh, 25-75% Angus or Red Angus, with up to 1/8th other or unknown ancestry as a Balancer. To be eligible to win a Ring of Gold Champion title, an animal must have earned ROG points from a minimum of two AGA ROG shows. There must be a minimum of 20 head within the separate division to qualify for AGA ROG points.
- Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline date. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
- All animals must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix, and will be inspected at the show at the discretion of the show management. If the tattoo is illegible or does not correspond to registration certificate, the animal is ineligible to show or may be re-tattooed by the exhibitor and rechecked at the end for processing at the discretion of the show management.
- All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the Show Management. Any deviation from the health requirements will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.

All entries must be accompanied by registration certificate to enter the show. All paper work will be checked by the Beef Cattle Office. Should registration papers or applications not be available, the animal will not be allowed to show. All registration papers and tattoos will be checked by the MLBA show committee at 4:00 p.m. on the day of arrival on all cattle eligible to show.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from the show.

Prizes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion bulls and females. This class will be held in conjunction with the Open Limousin Show. Bulls and females, including cow-calf pairs, placing highest in an open class and meeting all other requirements will be eligible for this special class. Division champions will not be selected for this show.

**NORTH AMERICAN LIMOUSIN FOUNDATION**

**Standard Rules and Regulations**

**for the Exhibition of Limousin Cattle; Level II/III**

1. Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF).
2. All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be:
  - A. 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates OR
  - B. Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates
 Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
3. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
4. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible and cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
  - A. Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; animals may be subject to white towel test;
  - B. The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tailheads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);
  - C. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue as an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;
  - D. Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.
 EXCEPTIONS: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the state veterinarian with the approval of the Livestock Superintendent.
6. Bulls one (1) year of age and older must show with a nose lead. The show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
7. The NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
8. The NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
9. Class size shall be to the discretion of the Beef Cattle Superintendent and staff, and may not contain more than 20 head. The given classes may be split or combined only within their given division.
10. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow/calf division are eligible to show as individuals and must be registered.
10. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, except birth marks.

**Other Requirements to Receive Points at Medal of Excellence Events**

**Performance Requirements:**

The following performance-data-submission requirements must be met by December 1 to receive MOE points:

- a) Birth weight (bulls and heifers)
- b) Weaning weight (bulls and heifers)
- c) Yearling weight (bulls and heifers)
- d) Yearling scrotal circumference
- e) Pregnancy test (females older than 600 days of season's end)
- f) Breed soundness exam and semen test (bulls older than 400 days)

NOTE: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special request from NALF.

**Credibility Requirement:**

- Exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations and animal health requirements for exhibitors in this premium book.
- All entries must be registered with the American Hereford Association. Animals with "Pending" or "Applied for" registrations at the date of the show are not eligible to compete.
- Exhibitor must be listed as an owner or co-owner on the animals AHA registration papers.
- All entries (including Cow/Calf pairs) will be measured, with no exceptions. Maximum height allowed to be shown in these classes is 45" on females and 48" on bulls and steers. Measurements and weight will be at 12:00 p.m. on "in-place" day at the scale. Failure to show will result in disqualification.
- Any animal exceeding the height limit will not be eligible to show.
- All horned and polled Miniature Hereford cattle will show together.
- The Missouri State Fair Beef Cattle superintendent reserves the right to combine or split classes depending upon total entries in class.
- Any animal without the correct, legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- One exhibitor per animal is allowed in the show ring. Exhibitors with disabilities must communicate their needs to the Missouri State Fair Beef Cattle Superintendent prior to show and will be pre-approved for limited assistance in the show ring.
- Classes will not be held for late exhibitor arrivals.
- Exhibitors or cattle that disrupt the class will be removed.
- Use of hemp hair, removed hair, or other hair-like materials added to the animal's body will not be allowed.
- No artificial filling (pumping/drenching) of animals will be allowed unless under the advice of a licensed, non-owner veterinarian. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will be disqualified.
- If an animal's registration has been obtained through misrepresentation or fraud, or if the date of birth, tattoo number, sire, dam or service information, or any other fact regarding the animal has been intentionally misrepresented, the entry and exhibitor will be disqualified from the event in its entirety and will not be allowed back for a period of two calendar years. This applies to all of the exhibitors' entries at that show.
- All exhibitors must adhere to the Code of conduct and Liability statement.

#### Cow/Calf Pair Rules:

- Cow/Calf Pair's must be registered with the American Hereford Association.
- There is no maximum age for cows.
- Cow must be measured for height and not exceed 45" at the hip.

2. Females: Only registered Red Angus females in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. Category 1A and 1B cattle will show together in the same class.
3. Bulls: Only registered Red Angus bulls in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. Category 1A and 1B cattle will show together in the same class.
4. Cow/Calf Pair Class: Cows with natural calf at side. Calf must not be more than 250 days old on the date of show. Your calf at the side of your cow must be registered.
5. **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows

1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered or recorded (50% - 75% with one parent a registered Santa Gertrudis), meeting the requirements for registration or recordation as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registration, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows as approved by the board of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International, PO Box 1257, Kingsville, Texas 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at [www.santagertrudis.com](http://www.santagertrudis.com).
2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. No outstanding balances on an active or junior members account.
3. ALL animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
4. Heifers 24 months of age or older must be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian or have produced a live, Santa Gertrudis sired calf with that calf at the side, meeting the Standard of Excellence and the calf must be registered by 30 days of age. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician in order to show.
5. All bulls classes 12 months of age or older must have a nose lead for show purposes.
6. All animals must be registered or recorded and PERMANENTLY identified before the show with a brand ID or and ear tattoo.
7. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be registered or recorded in the name of the junior member. This registered or recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. Ownership deadline is April 1 for all animals born January 1 of the preceding year and thereafter, and November 1 for all other animals.
8. a) **All purebred animals** must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.  
 Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.) trim tail to personal preference  
 b) **Star Five** exhibits are not subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be fitted blow and go. Hair may be brushed according to preference with no foreign substance/fitting materials on any part of the body.
9. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age.
10. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
11. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue.
12. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
13. Dress for exhibitors participating in SGBI sanctioned Open and Junior shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing and appropriate footwear – no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded -- no caps.
14. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, air, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. ALL animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
15. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanhip followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanhip paper.
16. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such

animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.

17. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgments, either past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration of use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
18. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association. This refers to, but is not limited to, the procedures to file protest and appeals process
19. **RULES FOR HIGH POINT AWARDS:**
  - a. For each point show, first place class winner will receive 2 points; second place class winner receives 1 point; Division Champion receives 3 points; Reserve Division Champion receives 2 points; Grand Champion receives 5 points and Reserve Grand Champion receives 4 points; Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points.
  - b. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards.
  - c. Points will stay with animal if sold.
  - d. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring.

**Rules**

1. All Missouri State Fair rules apply.
2. Animals competing in the Black Hereford Show must be registered in the American Black Hereford Association herd book and recorded in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the Missouri State Fair registration deadline.
3. Cattle must be entered under the recorded ownership 30 days prior to show. Jointly owned animals must be entered under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
4. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match registration papers. Any animal upon check-in, which does not have legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo) corresponding to the permanent identification on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be retattooed and rechecked at the show.
5. Altering the conformation or natural appearance of the animal is prohibited. This includes covering of white skin and the use of artificial tailheads, switches, or any use of false hair. Other prohibited products include illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals, or artificial filling. Any animal found in violation will be barred from showing.
6. Any winning animals in any and all divisions may be subject to DNA Parentage Verification (sire and dam only). If discrepancies in parentage are found the animal may be subject to forfeit its winning position and prize money premiums.
7. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the Missouri State Fair. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
8. All bulls one year of age and older must show with a nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show management.
9. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation by the show and sale committee including the age of the animal, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of show. Case may be referred to the ABHA for further action according to association procedure.
10. The registered owner and/or exhibitor must be a member in good standing with the ABHA.
11. Judges will have no preview of competing cattle or meeting with show exhibitors prior to the show. This is to maintain impartiality for all competitors and judge.
12. Classes are subject to change based on the number of entries.
13. Show management reserves the right to split large classes if deemed necessary.

Should a steer entered in the Open Carcass show be selected as the 4-H/FFA Grand Champion Steer or 4-H/FFA Reserve Grand Champion Steer of the Missouri State Fair in the 4H/FFA Steer Show, it will remain on the Missouri State Fairgrounds until after the Sale of Champions at which time it will be shipped for processing under the supervision of the Missouri State Fair Livestock Superintendent. **Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.**
4. When there is only one (1) exhibit in a class, the exhibitor will receive half of the premium money for the placing awarded by the judge.
5. Absolutely NO late entries will be accepted at weigh-in, unless approved by the Livestock Superintendent.
6. The Missouri State Fair does not guarantee premium money, merchandise, prizes or special awards. Because the State Fair Commission is without constitutional or statutory authority to borrow money for its operation, it reserves the right to prorate premium money because of state budget restraints.
7. At time of weigh-in, exhibitor must provide breed of sire for each steer entered and designate which class the steer will be entered in for live competition: Class 1 or 4  
 Class 1      Lean - Retail Division  
 Class 4      Quality Hotel - Restaurant Division
8. In the final carcass competition, each steer will be placed based on its USDA marbling score and percent of retail cuts.
9. All steers must be weighed between **9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 11**, at the Youth Building. **Every exhibitor is required to sign a livestock owner certificate and drug residue free form.** Exhibitors must check with the Beef Superintendent for stall assignment. 4-H & FFA EXHIBITORS: Please check regulations concerning entry deadline for Junior Show entries.
10. Steers must weigh between 1000 and 1550 pounds.
11. Weigh-in will be conducted by and under the supervision of officials from the Missouri Department of Agriculture, Divisions of Ag Business Development, Weights and Measures, and Animal Health.
12. **The On-Foot Show will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, August 12**, in the MFA Arena for all steers entered in the carcass contest. All carcass steers will be evaluated by the judge for yield grade and quality grade. A Live Evaluation Contest will be held during the On-Foot Show. Trophies and cash prizes will be awarded for this evaluation contest.
13. The live evaluation judge or carcass judge shall have the authority to disqualify from both the live and carcass competition any steer showing evidence of staginess, unsoundness or other undesirable traits.
14. All entries must be halter broken and any steer which shows evidence of being unmanageable may be dismissed from the show at the discretion of the superintendent.
15. **Carcass steers will be shipped for harvest and processing immediately following the Junior Steer Show on Tuesday, August 13. Each exhibitor is responsible for assisting in loading his/her steer. Steers will be processed at a processing plant, to be determined.**
  - A. The processing plant reimburses the Missouri State Fair for the steers on a grid basis. All steers are individually identified and reimbursed accordingly. However, the judge's quality and yield grades may differ from grades given at the plant. The Fair then pays the exhibitors for their actual carcass. Steer carcasses are subject to all premiums and discounts of the processing plant and the final total value of the carcass reflect those premiums and discounts assessed by the processing plant. Unfortunately on occasion, steers will grade as dark cutters which may result in market discounts. Exhibitors need to understand the risk of dark cutters and other discounts that may have a negative impact on their carcass value. Those entering steers in the carcass contest acknowledge these risks exist and the Missouri State Fair does not accept any responsibility for any discounts should any occur.
16. The Missouri State Fair reserves the right to have urine, blood, saliva and/or tissue tests performed on any market animal to detect practices not considered to be normal or usual animal husbandry practices, including the use of anabolic steroids, diuretics, feed additives or drug residues. An exhibitor of an animal producing a positive analysis of drugs, unapproved medication or chemical residues. **Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.**

#### 16. Carcass Evaluation Process:

- A. Determine the USDA yield grade to the nearest 1/10 of a grade. The yield grade derived from the USDA formula will be adjusted for hot carcass weight, fat thickness, KPH and ribeye area using the following adjustment factors:

- B. Determine the USDA marbling grade (to the nearest 1/3 of a grade) which will determine the window the carcass will compete in.
- C. Rank the carcasses on the basis of this weighted index (adjusted % cutability).
- D. Carcasses must have a 3.99 competition yield grade or better to qualify for placing in either carcass class.
- E. A quality grade of Standard or lower will not qualify for placing.
- F. Dark cutters will be placed at the judge's discretion.
  1. Full or partial dark cutters will not place in the top 5 of either class.
- G. Placing procedures:
  1. Collect all the quality grade and yield grade factors and identify all factors outside the category windows.
  2. Determine all quality grades (from USDA chart) and yield grades, where  $USDA\ YIELD\ GRADE = 2.5 + (2.5 \times ADJ\ BF) + (.0038 \times HOT\ WT) + (.2 \times \%KPH) - (.32 \times REA)$ .
  3. Adjust yield grades for non-conformity (carcass wt., adj. BF, KPH and REA outside windows), and record the competition yield grades.
  4. The Lean-Retail category will be ranked using 60% on % retail cuts and 40% on USDA marbling score. The Quality Hotel-Restaurant category will be ranked using 30% on % retail cuts and 70% on USDA marbling score.
  5. Rank carcasses on overall numeric score within each division.
17. Beef carcasses will be paid on a grid grade-and-yield basis at current market prices. All standard industry discounts for grade, weight, dark cutters, trim, etc. will be applied by the packer. Payments for steers will be mailed directly to exhibitors. Trucking fees, not to exceed \$40 for each animal, will be deducted from the exhibitor's livestock payment.
18. Exhibitors will be responsible for loss due to condemnation or bruise damage.
19. A copy of the final carcass results will be either sent via e-mail or mailed to each exhibitor.

What is the Live Evaluation Contest? It is an opportunity for individuals to participate in an educational activity associated with selecting slaughter steers by live and carcass traits and criteria. Anyone wishing to participate can enter this contest in the Junior or Adult Division. Age divisions will be as follows: Junior Division - anyone under 18 years of age; Adult Division - anyone 18 years and older.

Ten steers will be selected from the Carcass show entries to be used for the Live Evaluation Contest. A sample demonstration will be given on how to yield grade and quality grade slaughter steers prior to the beginning of the live evaluation contest.

Junior and adult contestants compete by guessing the actual carcass data collected on the 10 slaughter steers which are selected for the contest. Cash prizes will be awarded by the State Fair to the top 5 individuals in each division who are nearest to the actual carcass placings on the slaughter steers entered in this contest. The **MISSOURI CATTLEMEN'S ASSOCIATION** will present trophies to the top two junior and the top two adults. This is an excellent learning opportunity, not only for youth, but also for adults.
